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# Safety precautions

## Information for parents

Please read the operating instructions and safety precautions carefully before use. Explain the content and the hazards associated with using the phone to your children.



Remember to comply with legal requirements and local restrictions when using the phone. For example in aeroplanes, petrol stations, hospitals or while driving.



Mobile phones can interfere with the functioning of medical devices such as hearing aids or pacemakers. Keep at least 20 cm/9 inches between phone and pacemaker. When using the mobile phone hold it to the ear which is further away from the pacemaker. For more information consult your doctor.



Small parts such as the SIM card, sealing stop, lens ring and lens cap can be dismantled and swallowed by small children. The phone must therefore be stored out of the reach of small children.



The mains voltage specified on the power supply unit (V) must not be exceeded. Otherwise the charging device may be destroyed.

The power supply must be plugged into an easily accessible AC mains power socket when charging the battery. The only way to turn off the charging device after charging the battery is to unplug it.



The ringtone (page 44), info tones and handsfree talking are reproduced through the loud-speaker. Do not hold the phone to your ear when it rings or when you have switched on the handsfree function (page 20). Otherwise you risk serious permanent damage to your hearing.



Do not use an optical magnifier to look at the activated infrared interface [Class 1 LED product (classification as per IEC 60825-1)].



Only use original Siemens batteries (100 % mercury-free) and – charging devices. Otherwise you risk serious damage to health and property. The battery could explode, for instance.



You may only open the phone to replace the battery (100 % mercury-free) or SIM card. You must not open the battery under any circumstances. All other changes to this device are strictly prohibited and will invalidate the guarantee.

**Important:**

Please dispose of unwanted batteries and phones as permitted by the laws in your country.



The phone may cause interference in the vicinity of TV sets, radios and PCs.



Use only Siemens original accessories. This will avoid potential risks to health or property and ensure compliance with all relevant regulations.

**Improper use will invalidate the guarantee!**

These safety instructions also apply to Siemens original accessories.

**Improved data transmission**

In order for your phone to be able to transmit data at higher speeds, it is necessary to have a good connection to the network. Transmitting data can be delayed by the process of establishing a connection. To comply with guidelines on the effects of radio waves, you should keep the phone a distance of 22 mm from your body while transmitting data.

# Overview of the phone

## ① Joystick

- ① Press vertically down on the joystick to start an application or function.
- ② Scroll left, right, up and down to navigate in the menus.
- ③ OK key. Press **briefly** to confirm an action.

### In standby mode:

- ④ Press and **hold** to access the Voice dial or Voice command.
- ⑤ Press to access functions: up (Profiles), down (Phonebook), left (Sound album), right (Picture album).


## ② Call key

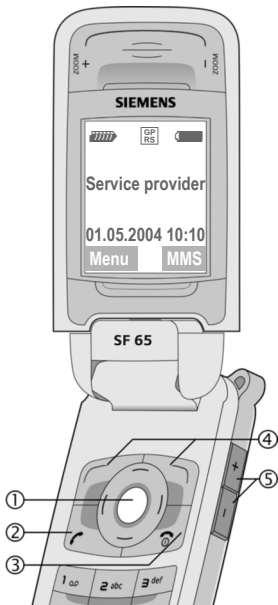
Make calls, take incoming calls, most recent calls displayed.

## ③ On/Off/End key

- Switched off: press and **hold** to switch on.
- Press to end a call during conversation or to reject an incoming call.
- Press **briefly** to go back to the standby mode.
- Press and **hold** to switch off.

## ④ Soft keys

The current functions of these keys are shown in the bottom line of the display as **Text**/symbol (e.g. ) . (The keys below the display also function as soft keys.)



## ⑤ Volume keys

- In standby mode: Press to increase or decrease the ringer volume level.
- During a call: Press to increase or decrease the earpiece volume level.
- Receiving a call: Press either of the keys **briefly** to mute the ringer. Press and **hold** either of the keys to reject the incoming call.

① **Loudspeaker**② **Call led**

Located on the reverse side of the clamshell. Activates e.g. when you receive a call or a new MMS or SMS.

③ **Display**④ **Integrated antenna**

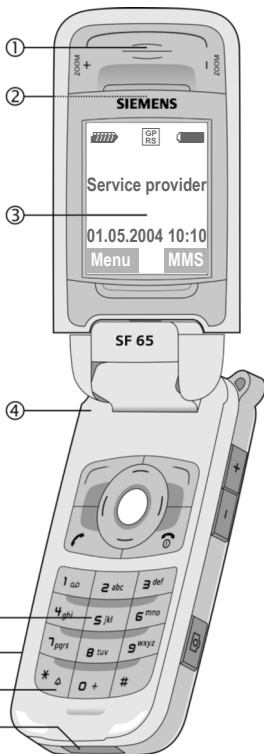
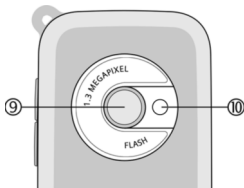
Do not obstruct the phone above the battery cover unnecessarily. This reduces the signal quality.

⑤ **Input keys**⑥ **IrDA interface**⑦ **Ringtone**

Press and **hold** in standby mode: switch all audible signals on/off (except alarm).

⑧ **Connection socket**

For charger, headset, etc.

⑨ **Camera lens**⑩ **Flash/Torch****Accessories**

**Changing to camera mode:**

To change the phone from the phone mode to the camera mode:

- ① Flip the clamshell gently 180° to the right (anti-clockwise) until it is on the reverse side ①.
- ② Close the clamshell ②.

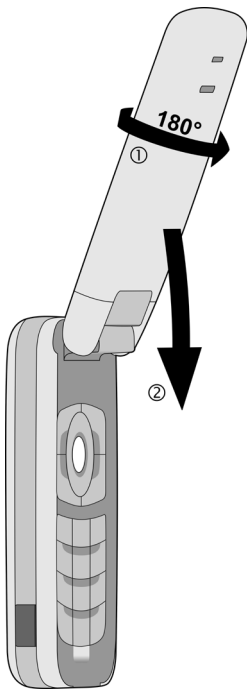
The camera switches automatically to the camera mode.

**Additional information**

The display can only be turned anti-clockwise!

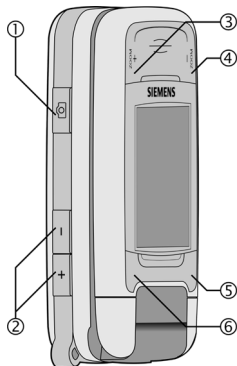
Follow the handling instructions carefully to avoid causing damage to the display hinge. Pay special attention to the correct direction to turn the display!



## Camera functions:

(These functions are only available when the phone is in the camera mode!)

- ①  **Camera key**
  - Press to take a photo.
  - Press again to save the photo in the picture album.
  
- ②  **Volume keys**
  - In camera preview: Press to activate / deactivate the Flash to take a picture or to use as a torch.
  
- ③  **Zoom in key**
  - Zoom in the preview image.
  - In menus: Press to go back a level in the list menu.
  
- ④  **Zoom out key**
  - Zoom out from the preview image.
  - In menus: Press to go forward a level in the list menu.
  
- ⑤  **Menu key**
  - Press to open the camera options menu.
  - In menus: Press to go forward a level.
  
- ⑥  **Landscape/Portrait key**
  - Press to switch between the landscape and portrait orientation.
  - In menus: Press to go back a level.
  - Receiving a call: Press to reject an incoming call.



### Additional information

It is not possible to make a call when the phone is in camera mode!

### Additional information

If you receive a call, a notification will be displayed, but you need to change the phone to the phone mode to accept the call!

# Getting started

## Inserting the SIM card/battery

The service provider supplies you with a SIM card that stores all the important data for your connection. Remove the SIM card from its holder before inserting it into the phone.

- Press the back cover button on the short side of the upper end of the phone ① until the latch comes out of the slot, and remove the cover ②.



- Insert the SIM card under the metal clip, with the contact surface facing **downwards**, until it is in place. ③ (Ensure that the chamfered corner is in the correct position.) Press the metal clip over the SIM card ④.



- Place the battery sideways in the slots. First insert its right side against the right edge of the phone ⑤, then press it downwards ⑥ until it clips.



- To remove the battery, press the inner clips one after another and lift the battery from the right edge of the phone.
- To replace the back cover, hook the clips onto the hinges on the bottom of the phone ⑦ and press the cover down ⑧ until the latch catches.



#### Additional information

Please switch off your phone before removing the battery!

Only 3-V SIM cards are supported. Please contact your service provider if you have an older card.

## Charging the battery

### Charging procedure

The battery is not fully charged when delivered. Plug the charger cable into the bottom of the phone ⑨, plug the power supply unit into a mains power socket and charge for at least **two hours**.



### Charging time

A flat battery is fully charged after about **3 hours**. Charging is only possible within a temperature range of 0 °C to 45 °C. If the temperature rises/falls 5°C above/below this, the charge symbol flashes a warning. The mains voltage specified on the power supply unit must not be exceeded.

## Operating time

The operating time depends upon the conditions of use. Extreme temperatures considerably reduce the phone's standby time. Avoid placing the phone in the sun or on a heater.

Talktime: 140 to 400 minutes

Standby time: 160 to 400 hours

## Charge icon not visible

If the battery has been discharged fully, the charge icon is not immediately visible when the power supply is plugged in. It will appear with two hours. In this case the battery is fully charged after 3 to 5 hours.

**Only use the power supply unit included in the delivery!**

## Display while in use

Charge level display during operation (flat-fully charged):



A beep sounds when the battery is nearly flat. The charge level of the battery is only displayed correctly after an uninterrupted charging/discharging cycle. You should therefore **not remove the battery unnecessarily** and where possible **not finish the charging process prematurely**.

### Additional information

The power supply unit heats up when used for long periods. This is normal and not dangerous.

If the battery is removed for longer than 30 seconds, the clock must be reset.

# Switch on/off, PIN entry

## Switching phone on/off




Press and hold.

## Entering the PIN

The SIM card can be protected with a 4-8 digit PIN.



Enter the PIN using the number keys. The characters appear as \*\*\*\* to ensure that nobody else can read your PIN code on the display. Correct with .



Confirm by pressing the joystick. Logging on to the network will take a few seconds.

## Emergency number (SOS)

### Only to be used in real emergencies!

By pressing the **SOS** soft key you can make an emergency call on any network **without** a SIM card and without entering a PIN. (Please note that this option is not available in all countries.)

## Switching on your phone for the first time

### Time/date

During initial set up, the phone first prompts you to check the date and time. After that, you can set the clock so that it displays the correct time. You will not have to make this setting again.



First enter the date (day/month/year), then the time (24-hour format).



Press this key. The time and date are updated.

## Copying SIM addresses

The first time the SIM card is inserted, the entries on it can be copied into the Addressbook memory. You can interrupt the copying procedure to, for example, receive a call, and then relaunch the copying process from settings in Phonebook.

You can also copy data from the SIM card at a later time (see page 23).

## General information

### Standby mode

The phone is in **Standby mode** and is **ready for use** when the name of the service provider appears on the display.



Press **briefly** to return (long press switches the phone off). You can return to the standby mode from any situation.

### Signal strength



Strong signal.



Weak signal.

A weak signal reduces the call quality and may lead to loss of the connection. Change your location.

### Main menu

Use the following keys to navigate in the main menu.



Call up from standby mode.



Select the application symbols.



Start an application.

### Main menu options

**Options** Open menu.

Different functions are available depending on the context.

## User guide

### Menu controls

The steps needed to reach a function are shown in a **condensed form** in the user guide. For example, the condensed form for displaying the call history for all calls is as follows:




This comprises the following steps:



Open main menu.



Select , then the **Call history** function.



Press to confirm.

## Symbols

The following symbols are used to explain an operation:



Enter numbers/letters



On/Off/End key



Call key



Soft keys



Displays a soft key function.



Press vertically down on the joystick, e.g. to access the menu.



Press the joystick in the direction indicated.



Function dependent on the service provider; special registration may be required.

# Standard functions

## Option menus

Below is a summary of functions that recur in options menus.

**Options** Open menu.

<b>Edit</b>	Open the entry to edit. You cannot change the language during editing.
<b>View</b>	Display entry.
<b>Delete/ Delete all</b>	Delete entry/delete all entries after confirmation.
<b>&lt;New&gt;</b>	Create new entry.
<b>Send via...</b>	Select transmission service and medium for sending or printing.
<b>Reply</b>	A message replies to the sender, "Re" is placed in front of the subject matter and the received text is included in the new message.
<b>Save</b>	Store entry.
<b>Copy to addressb.</b>	Save entries in the current Phonebook.
<b>Rename</b>	Rename selected entry.
<b>Show</b>	Display properties of the highlighted object.



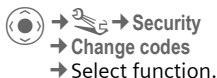
# Security

The phone and SIM card are protected against misuse by several security codes.

**Keep these security codes in a safe place where you can access them again if required.**

## Change codes

<b>PIN CODE</b>	Protects your SIM card (personal identification number).
<b>PIN2 CODE</b>	This is needed to set the charge detail display and to access additional functions on special SIM cards.
<b>PUK CODE</b> <b>PUK2 CODE</b>	Key code. Used to unlock SIM cards after the wrong PIN has been entered repeatedly.
<b>Barring code</b>	Used to set restrictions that prevent calling to certain types of numbers.



## PIN control

The PIN is usually requested each time the phone is switched on. You can deactivate this feature but if you do so, you risk unauthorised use of the phone. To be able to use all available security codes, you must have the PIN control activated. Some service providers do not permit deactivating the control.

**Select** Press.



Enter PIN.



Confirm entry.

**Change** Press.



Confirm.

- Select function.

## Change PIN

You can change the PIN to any 4-8 digit number you find easier to remember.



Enter **current** PIN.



Press.



Enter **new** PIN.



Repeat and confirm **new** PIN.

## Change PIN2

(Display only if PIN2 is available)

Proceed as with **Change PIN**.

## Change barring code

Proceed as with changing other codes.

## Clearing SIM card barring

If the PIN is entered incorrectly three times, the SIM card is barred. Enter the PUK (MASTER PIN) provided by your service provider with the SIM card in accordance with the instructions. If the PUK (MASTER PIN) has been lost, please contact your service provider.

# Text entry

## Text entry without T9

Press a number key repeatedly until the required letter appears. For example:



Press once **briefly** to write the letter **a**, twice to write **b** etc. Press and **hold** to write the number.



Press **briefly** to delete the letter before the cursor; press and **hold** to erase the whole word.



Move the cursor forwards/backwards.



Press **briefly**: Switch between *abc*, *Abc*, *T9abc*, *T9Abc*, *T9ABC*, 123.



Press to activate/deactivate the special characters.



Press **once/repeatedly**:

., ? ! ' " 0 + - ( ) @ / : \_

Press and **hold**: writes 0.



Writes blank.

Press **twice**: writes 1.

Press and **hold**: writes 1.

## Special characters



Press to activate/deactivate the special characters.

Press a matching key in the keypad to choose the special character you need.

## Text input with T9

"T9" combines the correct word from the various key inputs.



Activate/deactivate T9.

## Write with T9

**It is best if you finish a word without looking at the display.**

You simply press the keys where the relevant letter is located **once**.



A blank space or moving to the right ends the word.

Do not use special characters such as Ä. Instead use the standard characters such as A and T9 will do the rest for you.

## T9 word suggestions

If several options are found in the dictionary for a word, the most probable is displayed first.



Press. If this word is also incorrect, press the key again.



Keep pressing until the correct word is displayed.

Press **briefly**: Switch between **abc**, **Abc**, **T9abc**, **T9Abc**, **123**.



Press to activate/deactivate special characters: (page 18).

# Calling



Enter the number (always with dialling code/international dialling code).

**◀C** A **short** press clears the last digit, a **long** press clears the entire phone number.



Dial the phone number.

## End call



Press the End key **briefly**.

## Set volume



Use volume keys to regulate the volume.

## Switch to handsfree mode

A long press on the green key switches the phone to handsfree mode.

## Redial previous numbers



Press **twice**. The phone number **last** called is redialled.

Call up the redial list:



Press **once**.



Choose the phone number, then to dial press the ...



... key.

## Auto redial

### Auto redial

The phone number is dialled ten times at increasing time intervals.

## Accept call



Press.

Or

### Options

Open and select **Accept call** or **Accept in h/free**.

## Reject call



Press **briefly**.

Or

### Options

Open and select **Reject** or **Silent**.

### Additional information

Accept the call before bringing the phone to your ear in order to avoid ear damage caused by the ringtones.

Call with handsfree

#### Activate handsfree

Playback via loudspeaker (handsfree calling).

Always switch off handsfree talking before holding the phone to your ear! Otherwise, you may damage your hearing!

Remember to add a "+" in front of the number.

## Call options

#### Options

Functions that are only available **during** the call are offered.

## Swapping between 2 calls

### Establish a second connection

#### Options

Open menu.



Select new number from phonebook.

Or



Dial in the new number directly, the current call will automatically be put on hold.

#### Options

Open menu.

#### Swap

Swap between calls.

Or



use joystick to swap between calls.

## Incoming calls during a call

You will hear the "Call waiting" tone and you can now:

- **Accept the waiting call in addition to the first**



Accept the call and put the current call on hold.

Or

#### Options

Press to accept the call.

- **Reject the waiting call**

#### Reject call

Reject the call, or transfer it to the mailbox via Transfer option in the Call options menu.

Or, use



to reject the incoming call.

- **Accept the waiting call and end the current call**

#### Accept

Accept the new call.

Or



Accept the new call with joystick.



End the call currently in progress.

## End call(s)



Press the End key.

**Yes**

Resume held call.

**No**

End all calls.

## Conference

You can call up to 5 conference participants one after the other. Once you have established a connection:

**Options**

Open menu. The current call is put on hold.



Choose the new number from Calls list or from Phonebook.

**Or**



Directly dial the new number.

**Options**

Press when the new connection is established and select **Conference**. Repeat until all participants are connected.

## End



When the End key is pressed, **all** calls in the conference are ended.

# Phonebook

You can save e.g., the names and numbers of your acquaintances in your phone as contacts. You can save the contacts either in the memory of the SIM card (**Phonebook** option) or in the phone memory (**Addressbook** option). The **Addressbook** option is set as standard.

To save your contacts, select:



## New entry

To add a new contact to your Phonebook, do as follows:



Fill in the input fields:

### ENTER NAME:

Enter first and/or last names.

### Phone number:

Always enter the phone number with dialling code. An entry will not be saved without a phone number.

### Number type:

Select the type of the new entry, e.g. mobile, home, fax.

You can also select the following:

### Select group: (in the Addressbook option)

Allocate the entry to a group (page 25).

### Email: (in the Addressbook option)

Enter the e-mail address.

### Note: (in the Addressbook option)

You can enter text, if you want to add comments about the contact.



Save the new entry.

Remember to add a "+" in front of the number.



## Find entry/Call

-  Open Phonebook.
-  Select **Names list**.
-   Select a name with the first letter and/or scroll.
-  Call the selected number.

## Change entry

-  Select entry in Phonebook.
- Options** View options.
-  Select desired input field.
-  Make changes.
-  Press to save the changes.

## Editing the entries

The following options are available depending on what is currently selected.

- Options** Open menu.

<b>Change</b>	You can edit the name, number and type of the selected entry.
<b>Delete</b>	You can delete the entire selected entry.
<b>Send SMS</b>	You can send an SMS to selected recipient(s).

<b>Send MMS</b>	You can send an MMS to selected recipient(s).
<b>IrDA</b>	You can send the selected entry by IrDA.
<b>Show</b>	You can view the details of the selected entry.
<b>Copy to phonebook</b> (in the Addressbook option)	You can manually copy entries from the phone memory to the SIM card.
<b>Copy to addressb.</b> (in the Phonebook option)	You can manually copy entries from the SIM card to the phone memory.
<b>Call handsfree</b>	You can call the selected recipient with the handsfree function.
<b>Voice dial</b>	You can record a Voice dial to speed access to the selected entry.
<b>Flash dial</b>	You can access a speed dial to an entry by programming a Flash dial to the selected entry.

## Settings

The following functions are available, depending on what is currently selected.

**Options** Open menu.

Select group	Select the group allocated to the contact.
Select	Select either Addressbook or Phonebook.
Delete all	Delete the entire content saved in Addressbook / Phonebook.
Copy to addressb.	Copy all entries from the Phonebook memory to the Addressbook memory.
(For standard functions see page 15)	

## Group setup

To manage your **Addressbook** entries clearly, arrange your entries. You can select a group when creating a new entry or select an existing entry to modify the group settings. You can select a melody and a picture for the group. These are displayed when a caller from the group is calling.



Open Phonebook.



Select **Names list**.



Select the required entry.



Select **Options**.



Press **Select group**.

## Own numbers

Enter "own" phone numbers for information when **Phonebook** or **Addressbook** is selected.

## Emergency call

The Emergency call is always displayed at the end of the Names list. You cannot change the Emergency call as it is predefined (see also page 12).

## Call records

Phone numbers are saved to make it easier to redial them.

## Call history

The call list can store up to 30 entries. For example calls missed, calls received or calls dialled can be listed.

Open record.



Select phone number.

**Options / OK**

Select Call, Call back h/free, Send SMS, Send MMS, Details, Save, Delete.

### Access to the last calls



Fast access in standby mode.

## Reset

The call records are deleted.

## Durat/charges

Open report or settings.

**Reset**

Reset the selected setting.

**Cancel**

Cancel the selected setting.

## Total cost



Open menu.

### Charge rate

Enter the currency as well as the charge per unit.

### Show balance

The remaining amount of credit or units is displayed.

### Cost limit

Special SIM cards allow you or the service provider to define a credit limit.

**Reset**

Reset the selected setting

**Cancel**

Cancel the selected setting.

# Camera

You can view photos taken on the integrated camera immediately and

- use the photo as a background image.
- send the photo via MMS, IrDA or e-mail.

## Switch on

- Flip the screen gently 180 ° to the right until the screen is on the reverse side.
- Close the clamshell, see Overview of phone (page 4).
- The camera switches automatically to camera mode.
- For functions of the keys in camera mode, see Overview of phone (page 4).

### Additional information

The camera feature is automatically in use once you switch the phone to camera mode.

## Pict. resolution

It is possible to set the quality of the image regardless of the preview image resolution.

**Premium:** 1280 × 960 (SXGA)

**High:** 640 × 480 (VGA)

**Wallpaper:** 128 × 160

The resolution may decrease depending on the selected digital zoom. The wallpaper is adapted to the phone's screen resolution.

Press to take a photo.



Press to save the photo.

## SlideShow

See all available photos displayed on the screen one after another. Pressing any key stops the slideshow.

## Sleep mode

If you do not use the camera for two minutes, it automatically switches to the sleep mode. Press any key to return to the preview when sleep mode is activated.

## Camera options

The following functions are available, depending on the current situation.

- **Settings:**  
Picture quality, sound setting, reset settings.
- **Frames:**  
Choose Default frames, Own frames, or none.
- **Colour mode:**  
e.g, black, white, sepia.

The camera automatically takes the photo approximately 10 seconds after triggering. You hear a beep before last 3 seconds.
- **Flash:**  
Activate the flash before taking the photo.
- **Burst mode:**  
Take multiple photos with one shot.
- **Night mode:**  
Use when the exposure is very dark.
- **Picture orientation:**  
Use portrait for the phone screen and landscape for PC screen.

# SMS

You can transmit and receive very long messages (up to 760 characters) on your phone. They are automatically composed of several "normal" SMS messages of 160 characters (note the higher charges).


You can also send pictures and sounds with or without accompanying text in an SMS. Also, SMS does not support all types of pictures and/or sounds.


## Write/send

 →  → SMS → Send SMS


 Select <Add contact> to select a name in the displayed Names list or enter a new number. Repeat the procedure if you want add more contacts.

 Select <New>.

 Enter text (see also page 18) or select **Template** to use a standard message.

 Select <Add Media> if you want to insert a picture, text or a sound in the SMS.

Select from a list of possible attachments and press **OK**.

 Select **Save** if you want to save the message in the message list.

 Select **Send now** to send the SMS to the selected recipient(s).

The SMS is transmitted to the service centre from where it will be sent.

## Archive

 →  → Archive

The list of SMS messages stored in the phone is displayed.

## SMS to group

Perform the same procedure as when writing a standard SMS. Repeat the procedure as many times as necessary to add more contacts.

## Read



Arrival of a new SMS announced on the display.



To read the SMS, press the joystick or press **Read**.

# MMS

The **M**ultimedia **M**essaging **S**ervice enables you to send texts, pictures and sounds in a combined message to another mobile phone or to an e-mail address.

Depending on your phone settings, you will either receive the complete message or only a notification with sender details and size. The actual MMS can then be downloaded manually later.

## Create

An MMS consists of the address header and the content. The content may be several pages long. Each page may contain a text, a picture and a sound. Remember that pictures and sounds may be protected.

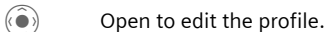

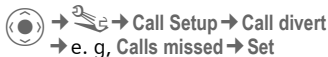

# Care and maintenance
